

Visa Documents for Retired People & Pensioners — PPO, Pension Proof & No-ITR Cases

What an officer checks in this document — and what gets it refused.

What this document must contain

Income first: the PPO — pension payment order — which is the single most useful document a pensioner has, together with the bank statement showing the pension arriving each month. Then status: the retirement or service certificate from the former employer, and the pensioner identity card where one was issued. Then assets and ties: property documents, fixed deposit receipts, and where relevant the spouse's position. Then the return you may still file — many pensioners do, and it should be included where it exists. If a child abroad is inviting or funding the trip, their invitation and financial documents sit alongside.

Do

- Lead with the PPO — it is your strongest single document
- Show six months of pension credits in the bank
- State plainly what you are returning to
- Include property and deposits as ties, not just as funds
- Attach the inviting relative's documents where they are hosting you

Do not

- Don't leave return intent to be inferred
- Don't submit a bank balance funded by a recent transfer from abroad
- Don't omit a spouse who is staying in India — that is a tie
- Don't apologise for having no employer letter
- Don't ignore medical needs; travel insurance and treatment continuity matter

Mistakes that get this document refused

- No PPO, so the pension is asserted rather than evidenced
- Balance funded by a large transfer from the child abroad shortly before applying
- Nothing in the file explaining what the applicant returns to
- Retirement certificate omitted, leaving the employment history unclear
- Invitation from the child abroad with none of their supporting documents
