

How to Write a Strong SOP for Canada Study Visa (Examples + Template)

What an officer checks in this document — and what gets it refused.

What this document must contain

1000–1200 words, one-to-two pages, single-spaced. First person. No flowery language. Use clear, simple English. Structure: Introduction, Academic Background, Why This Course, Why Canada, Why This Institution, Financial Plan, Return to India.

Do

- Be personal and specific — tell YOUR unique story
- Mention specific course modules, professors, or facilities
- Connect your past academics to your chosen Canadian program
- Show financial preparedness with exact figures
- Clearly state your return-to-India plan with specifics
- Proofread multiple times — grammatical errors hurt

Do not

- Don't use AI-generated SOPs without major customization
- Don't copy templates from consultants without personalization
- Don't discuss vague reasons like 'good infrastructure'
- Don't over-emphasize immigration intent
- Don't mention friends/family in Canada as reason to come
- Don't exceed 1200 words — officers won't read

Mistakes that get this document refused

- Generic reasons for choosing Canada (quality education, research)
- No specific connection between past studies and chosen program
- Vague career goals ('want to grow my career')
- Hinting at PR intent (major red flag)
- Spelling institution name wrong
